

Stewardship Audit for Leaders

A Heart Check for Faithful Leadership

Leadership requires us to think ahead—planning, deciding, and preparing for what’s next.

But it’s easy to focus so much on tomorrow that we overlook what God has entrusted to us today.

This Stewardship Audit isn’t about measuring performance. It’s an invitation to pause, examine your heart, and consider how you’re stewarding what God has already entrusted to your care.

Set aside 10–15 minutes. Begin with prayer, answer honestly, and invite the Holy Spirit to reveal anything you may be overlooking.

1. What have my prayers been revealing about what I’m expecting from God?

List the opportunities, goals, or outcomes you’ve been praying about.

2. What has God already entrusted to me?

Make a list of the people, responsibilities, projects, conversations, and opportunities God has already entrusted to your care.

3. Am I treating any of today’s assignments as placeholders?

Have I been treating any assignment as a placeholder until something better comes along?

Where have I been tempted to think:

“This is just temporary.”

“This isn’t important enough.”

“I’ll be more engaged when something better comes along.”

What assignment have I been overlooking because I’ve been waiting for something bigger?

4. Who have I overlooked?

Is there a client, employee, volunteer, ministry leader, small business owner, or even a conversation that deserves my full attention because God entrusted it to me? _____

Who came to mind? _____

5. What expectations am I carrying?

Have I decided that God's favor, growth, or leading has to look a certain way?

What expectations might God be inviting me to surrender?

6. Finish this sentence.

What's one person, responsibility, or conversation you'll approach differently this week because of what God has shown you today?

Closing Prayer
